Respond to the following questions in a 2- to 3-page essay format and submit to your professor for grading.

1. This movie outlines numerous instances where characters must make moral decisions and choose between their personal values and corporate success. Which ethical breach do you think was the most egregious, and why?
2. U-North is a fictitious company that represents the sometimes shady dealings of companies that know their products are hurting people and the communities in which they operate. Find another similar company that is currently under scrutiny for similar affects, and briefly explain their predicament.
3. Consider the press interview conversation:

Interviewer: So, with all that pressure and workload, how do you keep a balance between work and life?

Karen Crowder: When you really are enjoying what it is you do, who needs balance? There's your balance! There's your balance. When you're really enjoying what it is you do, there's your balance.
